## **Share the Good News of Christ**

—A Message from Pastor Bruce Tully

My Friends:

You have no idea how many people your life may have impacted in a short space of time until you come down with Covid! All of a sudden you start thinking, "who have I been with over the past five days or so?" can be a bit It overwhelming. Take it to the next level; with whom have THEY been in contact since you were with them? It can encompass a much greater number than you might imagine.

Throughout this season our attention is to be focused on the coming Christ. In the first event, over 2,000 years ago, the Jews were expecting a Messiah, the Chosen One of God. Since the birth, life, and death of Jesus the Christ, our outlook has shifted. We now look

forward to the returning Christ! Let's see what this has to do with a Covid outbreak!

Have you ever considered how many people your life touches on a daily basis? Whether it is through intimate knowledge of family or friends, a passing friendship, acquaintanceship, or just in passing, there are likely dozens, if not hundreds, of people who are touched in some way by your life, each day. As you realize that Jesus had come to save a people to Himself, and that God sent Him specifically to die for our sins, there is a stark realization that this is a gift—a gift that must be shared.


Christ the Lord.

#### ~ FROM CAROLYN MCLAIN, MUSIC DIRECTOR

"It's Christmastime — Why are we singing these weird-sounding hymns I hardly know?"

"Advent hymns...Christmas hymns — What's the big difference?"

"Aren't they all just Christmas songs?"

Good questions all! According to the church liturgical calendar, Advent is the first season of the church liturgical year. It includes the four Sundays before Christmas, usually beginning on the Sunday that falls on or nearest to November 30.

<u>Fun Fact</u>: Advent often begins during the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, but not this year! The first Sunday in Advent 2023 is December 3, and the fourth and final Sunday of Advent falls right on December 24, Christmas Eve.

The term "Advent" comes from the Latin word "adventus," which means "coming." It is the time each year when we look forward to the coming birth of Jesus. These four weeks are an opportunity to wait ... and to anticipate celebrating the birth of our Savior.

The Old Testament Scriptures are full of prophesies that tell of the coming of the Messiah:

Isaiah 9:6: For unto us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Isaiah 7:14: Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

God's people waited for lifetimes and generations for this promise to be fulfilled! This sense of longing is what we, too, can experience each December as we look forward to celebrating Jesus' birth. There's value in this anticipation, and the experience of waiting prepares our hearts for the joyful celebration of Christmas.

So why do Advent hymns sound sad? It's true; several of them are written in minor keys, but those more somber sounding melodies help to convey and express the longing for our Savior.

Why are the words a bit challenging to understand? The texts of many Advent hymns are rooted in Scripture and some date back more than 1,000 years! We shouldn't view them as outdated or irrelevant, but instead let's consider the bond we share with Christians who have been singing these great hymns for more than a millennium!

Please plan to come to our Advent Celebration on December 3 at 3:00 p.m. Our choir and musicians will feature wonderful arrangements of Advent hymns and songs. Members of our congregation will read Scripture passages that also point to God's promise of salvation through His Son.

Our new hymnal, <u>Hymns of Grace</u>, includes a wonderful selection of Advent hymns, many of which may be new to you. We will sing some of them in our worship services this December, and I hope you'll be blessed by the beautiful expressions of the deep longing we have for a Savior.

Wishing you a blessed Advent season, and a joyful Christmas!

- INTERIOR Caryn PAINTING, FLOORING, CEILINGS, WALLS, FURNISHINGS, JANITORIAL, PEST CONTROL, EMERGENCY CLEANUP
- MECHANICAL Jack Yoder & Patrick Tully HVAC, PLUMBING, ELECTRICAL, APPLIANCES, WATER SOFTENER, ELEVATOR.
- ELECTRONICS Dave Andrews SECURITY SYSTEM, CLOSED CIRCUIT SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM, AUDIO/VISUAL SYSTEM, CARILION SYSTEM, DIGITAL SIGN.

Review of Old Business items as outlined in the 11/7/23 agenda.

- Landscaping expenses YTD are \$6,200 with approximately another \$1,000 that will be needed next year (and in next year's budget) to complete the job.
- There are a number of additional items that need to be disposed of to make room for ministry needs.

Review of New Business items as outlined in the 11/7/23 agenda.

- A motion was passed to allow committee members to make purchases of needed items up to \$500. Purchases above that require committee approval. Skip distributed copies of the church's tax exemption certificate.
- Due to James Baker's decision to step away from this task, a new cleaning service has been hired. The new cleaning resource is anticipated to be approximately \$250 per week
- The purchase of a new backpack vacuum system to make it possible to efficiently clean window sills, pews, tables, etc. plus floors was approved at a cost of \$560.
- Esco has completed an update on the alarm system.
- The committee approved of adding a changing table to the lower level "elevator" bathroom which is ADA Compliant and it will be designated as Unisex rather than as a Men's Room. The smaller restroom will be similarly designated and used as "overflow."
- Caryn will also follow-up with a request to Gail for a couple signs in an attempt to prevent user-induced plumbing issues in the lower stairwell Ladies Room.
- The committee approved of removing one of the pews and an unused desk from the Narthex to make room for some other furnishings (rocking chair, other chairs) for young mothers.

Future Projects

• The committee will be revisiting and updating the <u>Book of Procedures</u> as it relates to Property details with a special focus on the cemetery.

#### B. Memorial

Special service remembering those who passed away in the last year. Good attendance.

#### C. Missions Committee

- Harvest Home: netted 260 lbs. of food and over \$600 in cash gifts.
- Income from Bazaar not completed, but will be used for local charity.
- Christmas gift "tree" presents will be \$50 gift certificates.
- Last Community meal will be this month. We will not participate in the future due to changes made that causes it to be less "community."
- The Activities Committee is coming to life again. Wait for announcement in December. (Not actually part of Missions. We'll find a better place next time.)

#### E. Fellowship with All Saints

Thanks for their help in setting up for the Bazaar. They are doing a much better job of closing the building and we are thankful.



December 22, in Cowan Hall from 7-9 PM, We will be showing


