Pastor Bruce often reminds us that worship is the most important thing we do. As part of our efforts to enrich and deepen our worship at Salem Hellers we made the switch to a new hymnal last year. Hymns of Grace includes many of the beloved hymns we've sung for years and adds a number of the more recently written hymns we had already begun to incorporate into our worship services during the last few years. This collection of great hymns of the faith and worthy modern hymns is a wonderful resource for our congregational singing.

As we've transitioned to *Hymns of Grace*, we have sung several songs for the first time. Learning great new hymns can be such a blessing, but it can also seem a bit daunting. We find such comfort and encouragement in the melodies and texts of the familiar hymns we've sung our whole lives. We know many of those words by heart and the tunes are part of the fabric of our worship experience. At Salem Hellers, we have the opportunity to embrace our own set of hymns that are deeply loved and appreciated by our congregation for the encouragement, comfort and biblical truths they provide.

Whenever we come upon an unfamiliar hymn, we should keep in mind that every hymn we know well now was unfamiliar to us the first time we heard it. Pastor Bruce, Dave and I have identified several of the more recently composed hymns in our hymnal that we hope will become loved and familiar to the whole congregation. We are exploring ways to introduce these rich and wonderful songs – to help you learn them and become comfortable with them. Each month we will focus on a hymn in a "Hymn of the Month" series. Whenever possible we will share the "story behind the hymn" and the featured hymn will also be included several times throughout the month in our worship services. Our hope is that you will be blessed by the biblical truths set to engaging melodies as we worship corporately.

I look forward to joining with all of you in song as we raise our voices in praise to our Heavenly Father.

## Mission Close-Up: Missions Fair Sunday

You are invited to a Missions Fair on Sunday, October 13<sup>th</sup>! Hosted by our missions' committee, the fair – held in Cowan Hall after the morning service – will give you the opportunity to meet the following missionaries and representatives of ministries we support . . .

1. Paul & Christy Dubois, serving at the JAARS headquarters in Waxhaw. North Carolina

JAARS is a worldwide, non-profit, mission aviation and support organization with a primary focus on Bible translation support operations. They also provide practical support in existion, land and maritime transportation

so provide practical support in aviation, land and maritime transportation, information technology and media to missionaries in remote parts of our world.

2. Nate & Krystal, serving with Christar

Nate and Krystal, who served faithfully for many years in Western Asia, are now preparing for service in a new country. Ask them about their recent fact-finding trip to the Balkan country they hope to move to next year!

- **3. Darlene Saunders**, representing TWR's Women of Hope Women of Hope is a ministry of TWR (Trans World Radio) which seeks to bring hope and healing in Jesus to women around the world and across generations.
- **4. Pastor Asif Masih**, serving in Pakistan with the Independent Church of India (ICI) ICI and Pastor Asif share the love of Jesus among the poorest of the poor in India and Pakistan by providing food and clothing. In a visit to our church in 2021, Pastor Asif told of the difficulties ICI faced in helping people during the COVID-19 lock-downs. Is distribution easier now? Ask him!
- **5. Shane Burkholder**, *Executive Director of Orphan Resources International (ORI)* ORI's primary focus is providing food to orphanages in Guatemala. With limited budgets and no help from the government, these orphanages struggle to provide basic food staples and other necessities. ORI distributes over 150 tons of food and 28 tons of milk every year to 53 of the 130 active orphanages in Guatemala.

**6. Carol Rabold**, representing Bible2School

Bible2School's mission is teach the Bible to children attending public school and inspire hope, showing them their unique value in Christ. Presently, Bible2School release-time classes are available to children in 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grade in 10 public schools in Lancaster County.

7. Sue Orth, representing SEEDS

SEEDS is a relatively new ministry that focuses on three key areas: Health, Education, and Housing. They seek to build bridges and strong partnerships between SEEDS, the Conestoga Valley School District, the CV community, and other non-profit organizations who are already doing great work.

We hope you will attend the Missions Fair and help us welcome these special people who have given their lives to serve the Lord. Be prepared to ask questions and learn more about them and their unique ministries. *See you in Cowan Hall on October 13<sup>th</sup>!*

## **Pastors Appreciate Your Prayers**

October is Pastor Appreciation Month, an observance that some clergy don't publicize. It's an ideal time to thank pastors for their dedication to God's people and the ministry. A written note, a card or even a free meal is a nice gesture of appreciation. But if you were to ask pastors what they'd like or what they need, most would probably reply, "Pray for me."

That's what the apostle Paul requested throughout his letters. To the church at Rome, he urged, "Join me in earnest prayer to God on my behalf, that I may be rescued from the unbelievers in Judea and that my ministry to Jerusalem may be acceptable to the saints, so that by God's will I may come to you with joy and be refreshed in your company" (Romans 15:30-32, NRSV).

As you appreciate and encourage your pastors, remember them in your prayers. Then let them know you're doing so!



#### **Hungry for Jesus**

Many residents of first-world countries avoid true physical hunger, snacking at the slightest stomach rumble. Spiritually, the opposite is common. Many people run on empty, unaware of or rejecting Jesus' free gifts of grace, love and abundant life.

In her Magnificat, Mary proclaims, "He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty" (Luke 1:53, NIV). To be filled with Jesus, first we must empty ourselves and hunger for him. But what does that look like?



At Bible.org, pastor Steven J. Cole writes, "Starving people aren't interested in new smart phones or computers, unless they can somehow sell them to buy food. Hungry people have one focus—where to find food. It consumes their whole existence. ... That's how we should hunger for God!"

Spiritual hunger leads to a feast of God's blessings. He generously gives us gifts that overflow into the lives of others. So let's share Jesus with people who are starving for him!

### **Veterans Day salute**

After fighting in World War II, Luther Bergeland wasn't done serving his country — or his God. The Minnesota farm boy, who "came back to faith" during combat, later served for decades as a military chaplain. For his actions in the field in Korea, Bergeland was awarded the Bronze Star. Then during Vietnam, he served in the Army Reserves in Colorado, tasked with informing family members about soldiers' deaths.

Despite the challenges, Bergeland embraced the special role he was able to play for four decades, sharing Jesus and his love with countless people. "That's what we did, preaching and reaching out to people," he told a reporter. "I always liked the military very much because it just did a lot for me, and I hope I did a lot for it."

On Veterans Day, we salute Bergeland and all the men and women who selflessly serve.
