My Heart is Filled with Thankfulness is a wonderful example of the theologically rich compositions by musicians Keith Getty and Stuart Townend. Written in 2004, it is a modern hymn, traditional in structure and intended to by sung by congregations.

**The music:** In the process of hymn writing, music may be set to an existing text, however for this hymn, Keith Getty wrote the melody first, inspired by old Scottish folk melodies.

**The text**: Stuart Townend penned the lyrics based on the theme of thankfulness found throughout Paul's letters in the New Testament. Getty affirms that "the focus of thanksgiving is on God's spiritual blessings: present and future, not just personal past, circumstances, safety, health, or all the other things that we usually say "thank you" for, rather thankfulness tied to our spiritual condition." He cites 1 Thessalonians 5:18 -- we are to be thankful in all circumstances, but Paul always emphasizes what Christ has done for us in the past (the Good News of the Gospel), what he is doing for us right now, and our thankfulness for the promise we have in the future (salvation). Paul ties everything to that hope, so we can move forward with confidence, with courage, and with peace of heart; with joy in everything that we do.
