The text was written by Contemporary Christian Music singer and recording artist, Margaret Becker. She has been nominated for four Grammies for her work as a singer, guitarist and songwriter. The hymn text of "Jesus, Draw Me Ever Nearer" reflects her commitment to a "heart-deep honest writing style".
