Yet Not I, but Through Christ in Me is a composition of CityAlight, a music ministry of St. Paul's Castle Hill Church in Sydney, Australia. Their name is based on Matthew 5:14-16 and their vision is "to write songs with biblically rich lyrics and simple melodies for Christian churches to sing." Formed in 2013, the ministry has gained international recognition but still operates as a local church ministry with part-time musicians and volunteer participants. Recordings of their songs are made in their church building, and the congregation participates.

"We pray that the lyrics and melodies of these songs would fix eyes, hearts, and minds on Jesus.". Contemporary worship songs are often written quickly and produced in high volume, but CityAlight favors a slower timeline and careful process: "There is a lot of danger in potentially misleading or teaching slightly wrong things through your songs...songs have to be so deeply, deeply rooted in Scripture, if you're going to be recalling them like that. And if they're even a little bit off...it has the potential to lead people astray or confuse them. The stakes are very high."

The Lyrics: CityAlight song writers Richard Thompson and Jonny Robinson worked together for several months to write Yet Not I, But Through Christ in Me. "We dove deep into the idea of what it meant to have Christ dwell in us. What an incredibly profound, mysterious truth. It needed time. We wrote and rewrote the song many, many times. We struggled for every word." The text is based on Galatians 2:20, 2 Corinthians 12:9-10 and Philippians 1:6. Thompson and Robinson explain: "Having Christ in us does not mean we do no more work, and neither does it mean we do it all. Rather, we contend, and we contend with his energy. Even our final resurrection is made possible by the gift of Christ in us. He will bring us to glory. In our weakness he is strong, and he will complete the work he has begun. He himself is within us, leading us home, step by step. Every believer has been given this gift. It's worth singing about!"
