The Story Behind the Hymn: Eternal God, I Seek You Now was written in 1988 by Robert Hochstaetter. The lyrics were composed on a sunny afternoon when he had finished preparing a series of Bible study lessons to be taught on the attributes of God. Robert identified the familiar hymn tune, DUNDEE (often used as a setting for God Moves in a Mysterious Way) as a possible melody for his hymn. His lyrics also work well with a more recent hymn tune with chorus by K. Jason French, found in Hymns of Grace #88.

The Meaning: If we have an earnest desire to seek and know the eternal God, our creator, then he graciously promises to reveal himself to us. So how does this occur? First, from general revelation (the creation) and then specific revelation (God's written word, the Holy Bible). As we read the Bible, we learn about God's unique attributes (divine characteristics) that set him apart from all of his creation.

The lyrics of this hymn identify some of the titles ascribed to God that focus upon his authority. Then some absolute attributes that describe the inner being of God are revealed followed by the relative attributes that correspond to these absolute attributes.

The lyrics also list an appropriate conclusive thought about these attributes in each stanza to what has been acknowledged. The hymn ends by recognizing the trinitarian nature of God giving him all the glory he deserves.

Let us sing this hymn with reverence and a heart-attitude of praise and thanksgiving that he desires to be known and gives us the opportunity to do so through the redemptive work of Jesus Christ that is accomplished and applied to our lives. Soli Deo Gloria! -- Robert Hochstaetter
